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Bass Guitar Recorder Requirements 2026

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1. Information and general guidelines

1.1 Introduction

This document outlines the requirements for Recorded Grades and Recital Grades in Bass from Step 1 to Grade 8, including technical work, set repertoire, and discussion questions. For information about in-person exams, the full performance guidelines and assessment criteria, please refer to the current [Bass Syllabus](#).

Recorded Exams

Recorded exams provide the opportunity for the assessment of musical performance through the submission of a video recording, rather than attendance at an examination venue. Performances are assessed by trained LCME examiners using the same standards and criteria as for in-person examinations.

1.2 Validity

These specifications apply to Recorded Bass exams (Recital Grades) from 1 September 2026 until further notice.

LCME graded exams are open to all and there are no minimum age restrictions. No prerequisite qualifications are required for entering any exam; candidates can enter at any level provided they have the required knowledge, skills and understanding.

Introductory examinations

LCME also offers one level of introductory examination in Bass: Step. The pass bands are the same as for the graded examinations (Distinction (85–100% of the total marks available), Merit (75–84%) and Pass (65–74%). These exams are not regulated by Ofqual.

1.5 Assessment and results

Assessment

Exams are assessed according to the same standards and criteria as for LCME's in-person exams. Refer to the details listed in the assessment and regulations sections in the current [Bass Syllabus](#).

Marking

Qualifications are awarded by the University of West London (UWL). Exams are conducted by trained examiners. Candidates will be assessed on their technical accomplishment, musical knowledge, musicality and communication. In awarding marks, examiners will take into account the extent to which each of these assessment objectives is demonstrated within each exam component.

Issue of results

Candidates will be informed of the results of examinations as soon as possible. Results are available soon after the examination and certificates for successful candidates are normally dispatched within eight weeks of the date of the examination.

2. Recorded Exam requirements

2.1 Summary of exam requirements

Recorded Recital Step, Grades 1–5

Recital grades are performance-focused graded exams, using the same repertoire and supplementary test requirements, with the format set out below.

- **Component 1: Bass Patterns**

Candidates perform two bass pattern tracks from the handbook of the equivalent level.

- **Component 2: Performance**

Candidates perform one developing bass line over a backing track from the handbook of the equivalent level.

Recorded Recital Grades 6–8

Recital grades are performance-focused graded exams, using the same repertoire and supplementary test requirements, with the format set out below.

- **Component 1: Bass Patterns**

Candidates perform two bass pattern tracks from the handbook of the equivalent level.

- **Component 2: Performance**

Candidates perform two developing bass lines over a backing track from the handbook of the equivalent level.

Regulation
